### Mooring Waiting List Application Rules

1. A Member wishing to be allocated a mooring position must first register their interest with Club Secretary by completing an “Application to be placed on the Mooring Waiting List”.
2. A Mooring Waiting List is maintained by the Club Secretaries office. On receipt of an application to be placed on the mooring waiting list the Club Secretary will place the Members name at the next free position (at the end) of the list.
3. Member’s names remain in this chronological order.
4. Members on the list will be written to yearly to determine if they wish to remain on the waiting list.
5. If a mooring becomes vacant then the Secretary will identify the first name on the Mooring Waiting List and table that name at the Boatshed Committee Meeting to request approval to allocate a mooring to the Member identified.
6. Following approval by the Committee the Secretary will write to the Member offering them a club mooring and advising them that they have 2 weeks to accept the offer or it will lapse and be made to the next Member on the list.
7. The offer is made only to the Member on the waiting list and may not be transferred to any other Member.
8. If the Member does not accept the offer they move to the bottom of the Mooring Waiting List.
9. Once the acceptance has been received from the Member they will be advised to contact the Dock Master to discuss the size of the yacht, the available moorings and make arrangements for the arrival date of their yacht.
10. The ability to allocate a mooring may be compromised by the size of the Member’s yacht and the size of the mooring available. If this is the case this limitation will be identified and discussed at the Boatshed Committee level. If there are no available moorings of sufficient size to accommodate the Members yacht they will not lose their position in the list.
