The venues in race order and crew numbers were the Dangar Island Bowling Club (7), Galley Foods at Bobbin Head (6), Halyards Restaurant at RPAYC (8) and the Wharf Restaurant at Church Point (9). Numbers were slightly reduced by some crew being shanghaied to race boats on several days. Participating boats were Magnificat, Matang, Patricia VII, Prime Time, Sweet Chariot and Wah Moon.

Dangar Island is a picturesque place with lush vegetation and an active community of friendly residents. We took one boat and anchored off the public jetty leaving room for the regular ferry then tendered ashore. The bowling club prepared a very good lunch.

This is a very popular place and richly deserved as the menu is extensive and excellent.
