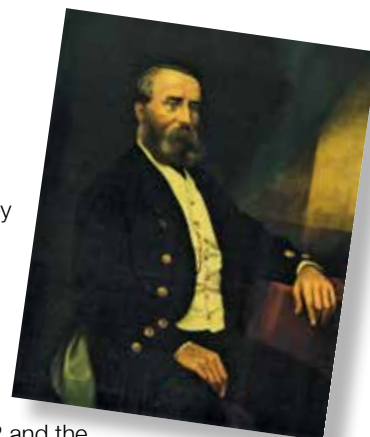

## Squadron Treasures – The Mankiller Gun

This gun, on display in the Neutral Bay Verandah, was common in the 1700-1900 period. They were made in small villages throughout Borneo, Malaya and the southern Philippines.

The gun was mounted on the bulwarks of vessels for protection. They were loaded with shot balls, stones and anything nasty to kill crew of opposing vessels, usually pirates.



## RSYS Future Fund

In 2018, the Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron (RSYS) Foundation relaunched the Endowment Fund now to be known as the RSYS Future Fund.
