Squadron Treasures – The Kirribilli Bell

The bell is mounted on the wall in the Neutral Bay Verandah and the inscription says 'Kirribilli' The First Steam Ferry To run between Sydney Cove and Milsons Point 1861. Kirribilli was a paddle steamer built in 1860 and carried 60 passengers. She was wrecked in 1879, when having gone into Port Stephens for shelter, she drove on shore in Nelson's Bay.

There is some question over whether it is actually a bell from the 1860 ferry or a later ferry of the same name.
